

How I Grew It: Nematanthus gregarius or "hybrid"

I heard from one of the judges on the panel that judged the three beautiful specimen nematanthus plants that they thought my entry had been grown in a greenhouse. The truth of its growing conditions are not quite as wonderful as that! Who wouldn't love a greenhouse for all of their sun-loving plants? The plant was actually grown at my office. I have a large eight-foot window where I am just starting to experiment with some of my plants that just don't do well under lights. I currently have three large plants growing in the window: Nematanthus hybrid, the Aeschynanthus pulcher variegated that was also in the show, and a Henckelia 'Moon Walker'. The window faces west, and the nematanthus gets full sun from about 12:30 to 6:00 p.m. in the summer. The plant is back from the window about one to two feet, and it drinks about two litres of water a week. I bottom water it a couple of times during the week giving it as much water as it will absorb. It is fertilized with MiracleGro for tomatoes 20-20-20, at 1/4 tsp. per 1.5 litres water for one of the waterings during the week. Any other watering is clear without fertilizer. The plant will be shown one more time at our local fair, the CNE in mid August, and then I intend to pot it up to a larger pot while simultaneously taking tip cuttings for new plants for the club. I am also trying to set seed to further verify its identity as Nematanthus gregarius. I know what the label said when I bought it but, until it sets seed and I see the orange berries, I will be growing this one as Nematanthus hybrid.

Elvin has written many books and articles on gardens and gardening, indoors and outdoors, for many years. come. I will provide a cell phone number for you to call if you need directions.

You don't need to RSVP. Everyone is welcome, even at the last minute. Admission is free. We are glad to have visitors and your guests. There will be a small fundraiser at the talk for The Gesneriad Society's Conservation Fund and the Elvin McDonald Research Fund. No one is required to donate, but it's a delightful excuse to contribute. There will be gesneriads, books and other plant stuff. Dale Martens has kindly offered to send some cuttings and leaves. You are welcome to participate if you like. There will be books by Elvin McDonald and he will autograph them. You may bring your own and he will sign them for you.

The Botanical Collection of the University is two blocks away, in the CBS greenhouse. We have 1,200 species of green plants in nine rooms under glass. The collection includes many unusual plants from over 100 families of green plants. I have 24 hour access and will give a tour in the morning, and after the talk if requested in advance.

In the morning, we will have Alan LaVergne's excellent webinar on Sinningias, and other activities at the CBS greenhouse. Please do RSVP if you would like to join us in the morning.

We will host a Chinese Banquet dinner in Elvin's honor Saturday night.

Anyone is welcome to come for Elvin's talk at 2:00 p.m., and the morning also, if you would like to join us.
