New *Sinningia speciosa* hybrids

This is one of my earliest hybrids, but after all this time, I still like it. Just like an antique car, the slipper-shaped flower gives the plant a retro effect, while the Sinningia 'Bristol's Good Morning' parent has added extra petals beyond the usual five it should normally have. What the plant lacks in number of flowers, it more than makes up for in size. These features cause the plant to make a strong statement. The deep purple color makes

This is one of my latest hybrids *Sinningia* 'Rock Futures'. It has white flowers that are marked with pink shading and dots. The petals have smaller dots towards the outside of the flower surrounded by a pencil thin white edge. This plant is growing in a five inch pot and the flowers are almost as wide. The foliage is not as tidy, and the venation is not as pronounced as I would like. I'm thinking with a little more work, I might have something really nice.

This hybrid is named after my late niece, Maria Hart-Crow. Her favorite color was red. She had a favorite dress she used to wear that was almost as dark and vibrant as this flower. The peloric flowers are over three and a half inches and very dark red. I took this picture in the sunlight so people could see that the plant is really as dark as it shows in the photo. I wish that I had a car





painted this color. It is one of my latest registrations and its name is *Sinningia* 'Rock Loves Maria'.


