

Happy 70th Anniversary: Elvin McDonald and The Gesneriad Society Dale Martens

When Elvin McDonald was 14 years old, he was struggling to grow some *Sinningia speciosa* ("Florist Gloxinia") plants he'd ordered as tubers. He typed a letter to a magazine called *Flower Grower* on a typewriter he'd purchased with money from selling a prize pig. Elvin asked people with an interest in the Florist Gloxinia to write him a letter. His family's mailbox became filled with letters. In 1951 with the assistance of some adults including Peggie Schulz who became Elvin's *The Gloxinian* co-editor, Elvin founded the American Gloxinia Society. When he was asked about this, his response was that he was amazed his parents let him do it.

The founding of the American Gloxinia Society was in 1951. Today it is known as The Gesneriad Society because it has members from all around the world, and all gesneriads are featured including Streptocarpus, Episcia, Primulina, Kohleria. African violets, and many more! The **Gesneriad Society** has a judged show



When we moved back home to the Midwest after my husband retired, Elvin was the Botanical Educator and Ambassador Emeritus for the Greater Des Moines Botanical Garden in Iowa. My husband and I visited him, and we got an amazing tour of the garden. Trust me, even in his 80's it's a challenge to keep up with him when he's walking.
