Charles Huston from the University of Minnesota, USA sent this photo on the right of *Primulina ophiopogoides*. It is growing in fired clay pellets, watered less in winter, and given a little extra fertilizer starting in January. It lives in the cloud forest room of the University greenhouse in very strong filtered sunlight. The plant receives reverse osmosis water with very dilute MSU (Michigan State University) fertilizer with most waterings.

Streptocarpus subg. Streptocarpella 'Blueberry Creme'

I have grown this plant for many years. Last year, I decided I was going to make some room on my plant shelves by putting it outdoors on the patio. It flourished there, blooming all summer long. It turned completely green, with no signs of the crown-type variegation for which it is known. I was surprised, as this had never happened previously in all the years I have grown it. Accepting the challenge, I took a few cuttings, washed them well in soapy water, rinsed and put them down, enclosing them in a plastic bag. After several weeks, I weaned them from the terrarium conditions after inspecting them for any signs of parasites or disease. I usually "feed" my outdoor plants to Jack Frost as opposed to bringing them indoors after being outside. Our patio is screened in, but we all know that critters are not stopped by screening. As the cuttings grew, they began to display the variegation which is expected! Once again, I was surprised and pleased.



Sinningia speciosa 'Pedra Lisa'

I visited the region of Brazil where *Sinningia speciosa* 'Pedra Lisa' is found two or three times, the first was in 2011. "Pedra Lisa" in Portuguese means 'smooth stone', which refers to one of the giant granite hills nearby. This form of *S. speciosa* grows in several places near a place called Pedra Lisa Hotel Fazenda. We collected it on the banks of a small stream that flows out of the hotel, and also saw plants in a couple of places down the road. *Sinningia speciosa* 'Pedra Lisa' is one of the best forms of *S. speciosa*; its appearance is striking, and it is easy to grow. I introduced it to cultivation at the 2012 convention of The Gesneriad Society in Seattle, WA.



It's a great plant. I have made many crosses with this form in my attempts to breed new cultivars of *S. speciosa* with wild-type flowers that come true from seed.
