





Henckelia ceratoscyphus

Joe Palagonia brought in potted suckers from his plant and gave one to everyone in the Long Island Gesneriad Society last June 2018. This plant was grown by Levente Hajdu of Bellmore on Long Island, New York and flowered February 2019. When I first got it, I thought it needed a humidity dome. But after about four months I was advised, based on observations from the group, that it would do well without the dome. Besides it was outgrowing it anyway. The average home humidity in the room it grows in is 50% with dips and peeks between 40-70%. Temperatures are between 65-79°F. The heating in the house is a little bit temperamental. It is grown about six inches below two T12 tubes. It could be a little lower but it's a height limitation of my rack and may account for the thick foliage. It has been re-potted two times from the original little cup I got it in. Potting mix is a general 2/1/1 peat, perlite, vermiculite mix with a little bit of dolomite and crushed oyster shell. The bottom of the pot has a layer of pure perlite by the drain holes to promote draining and oxygenation. It is placed on light diffuser plastic grid so any excess water falls through to a brine pool below. No wick is used. It likes to be kept on the moist side or else it starts to flop down and lose bottom leaves very quickly. I water with 1/4 to 1/8 tsp. Miracle-Gro 20-20-20 with micronutrients per gallon of water as needed. The outside of the flower is white with a hint of purple or blue. Leaves and flowers have a slight hint of stickiness to the touch. The crown of the plant suckers readily and it is in fact just a mass of suckers.

2019 Cincinnati Celebrates Gesneriads

Online Registration Now Open

On Tuesday, July 2, there will be two trips offered. The morning trip will travel to beautiful Eden Park for a spectacular photographic view overlooking the Ohio River, then on to Krohn Conservatory, a beautiful art deco glasshouse built in 1933. The rainforest-under-glass exhibit contains more than 5,000 plants from all over the world. There is



also an internationally known "Butterfly Show" where thousands of butterflies are free to fly throughout a specially themed garden. Next we will visit the Cincinnati Art Museum, also located in Eden Park, which features a diverse collection of more than 65,000 artworks spanning 6,000 years including paintings, sculptures, decorative arts, fashion, photography, and prints. A special exhibit - Kimono: Refashioning Contemporary Style celebrates the enduring influence of the kimono on fashion. Inspired by materials, forms and decorative motifs since the opening of Japan in the midnineteenth century, western fashion designers, alongside other artists, have produced works that acknowledge a Japanese persuasion — may be viewed for an additional cost if you choose. The museum has two Rookwood areas of note. The "Dueling Divas" exhibit describes the early rivalry of its founder and her competitor, essentially starting the Art Pottery Movement in the US in the 1870s. The Cincinnati Wing also has an extensive collection of historic Rookwood pottery along with Architectural Faience. You may lunch on your own at the Terrace Cafe.
