For Me, Under My Conditions

As growers, whether for show or our own pleasure only, we all admire the well grown plants of others. Every club has veteran growers who consistently bring in plants that are examples of good growing. As we admire those plants and pick the brains of the owners, we are tempted to replicate the conditions under which those plants were grown, the soil mix, the fertilizing routine and other factors under which they were grown. Time to raise a red flag!

Each of us has different conditions under which we grow: natural light, artificial lights of various types and strengths, fertilizer choices, water and soil mix choices. There are way too many factors involved to replicate the exact conditions and culture under which those envied plants were grown. Even after many years of personal experience, I recall receiving advice from a respected fellow-grower on where to place a certain plant to have it perform its best. I took that advice only to see the plant go downhill and die a few weeks later. It was doing well where I had it, previous to that move.


Individual choices in culture factors and environmental conditions have to be considered. There is no harm in trying a different technique, fertilizer, watering method, or other factor, but always limit your trial to one or two plants and never the entire collection. I have heard horror stories from growers who decided to try something different and/or in addition to their normal routine and cultural practices only to find that their plants did not do well at all. An experiment is just that: an experiment, a trial. Never try anything new on more than a select few of your plants. If it works, fine. Only then should you or could you move it into the cultural practice for the entire collection.

I have given many presentations to garden clubs and various horticultural judges groups. I have also been in the audience for that type of presentation by other expert growers. I loathe to hear a presenter say something that insists on everyone using this soil mix, or that watering practice, or this type of fertilizer, etc. It is far better to encourage individuality and learning what works best for you, under your conditions. Every one of us is different and our growing situations and factors are different. What works for me may not work for you. Learn what works for you and "if it ain't broke, don't fix it"!

Gesneriads in Bosnia and Herzegovina

Larisa Sabanovic is a pioneer in the cultivation of gesneriads in the Balkans where she lives. She started growing them seven years ago with 90 varieties and now has over 500 varieties. There was no written growing information in Serbo-Croatian when she began. She knows Russian and learned everything from the FrauFlora forum. Larisa started posting pictures of her plants online and people asked her to sell rhizomes. She soon had a thousand customers! She opened the AHI-LARI Facebook group where she helps teach beginners how to grow achimenes, kohlerias, and other rhizomatous gesneriads. Dale Martens is a member of this group and says that there are currently over two thousand members!
