Gasteranthus quitensis is native to Ecuador and nearby Colombia, where it is terrestrial in shade and grows under the warm tropical forest. It requires high humidity and filtered light. This was grown under a dome with LED light in an office, not the greenhouse. A saucer of water kept the free draining soil mix always moist.

Joel says, "I love this species. It flowers and sets seed easily, and the foliage smells sweet like honeysuckle."




